





Participants will: 1. Examine how assessment drives the rigor of instruction and how it impacts student achievement. 2. Analyze the accessibility features of each format, in order to adapt instruction to address the physical and cognitive needs of students. 3. Critique what participants are currently doing in their own districts and determine how quarterly common assessments could be implemented to customize instruction.
